A WPAi poll conducted on behalf of Steve Garvey for Senate in California, February 19-21, 2024, shows Steve Garvey in a strong second place in the primary race for U.S. Senate. Garvey is winning the NPP vote as he has consolidated conservative independents while left-leaning NPP voters are split among the three Democrats. Garvey is dominating the Republican vote.

Steve Garvey is in a strong second place in the primary election for U.S. Senate.

- Garvey trails Adam Schiff by three points and is nine points ahead of Katie Porter.
- Eric Early is not causing any meaningful split in the Republican or conservative NPP vote and is at just 4% on the ballot.

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Steve Garvey is dominating the Republican vote and conservative Independents while the three Democrats split the left-leaning vote.

- Garvey leads among No Party Preference voters because he is consolidating the conservative independent vote while the more left-leaning Independents are split among the Democrats.
 - Garvey is also winning three-in-five Republican votes and Eric Early is winning just 11%.
- Adam Schiff is winning 40% of Democrats and 24% of NPP voters.
 - Katie Porter wins 22% of Democrats and 14% of NPP voters.
 - Barbara Lee wins 13% of Democrats and 11% of NPP voters.

The top issues that voters want a candidate to address are strong points for Garvey.

- Illegal immigration and Border Security and Inflation and Cost of Living are the overwhelming top priorities of voters with nearly half of all primary voters saying one of those two issues is the number one problem they want a candidate to address.

Methodology

WPAi conducted a poll of n = 800 likely primary voters in California. Data was collected February 19-21, 2024, by live telephone interview. Sixty-five percent (65%) of interviews were conducted to cell phones and 35% to landline phones. The sample was selected from the California voter file and was stratified by geography, age, gender, party registration, ethnicity, educational attainment, and vote history to ensure a representative sample. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 3.5\%$ at the 95% confidence level.
